Vermont License Plate History Facts

- 1. The 1905 article in the Vermonter was published in July 1905, just 3 months or less after vehicles had to be registered at all! So, the highest plate number (#373) was just part way thru the year 1905. The **last** number issued in 1905 was # 509. While this is important to the license plate collector world, registrations were not annual at this time. It was a one time requirement.
- 2. Vermont's first plate was blue with white numbers, made of porcelain enamel over steel with the caption "Vermont Automobile Register" along the top. Again, no date since registration was not annual. Also, only 1 plate was issued for the rear of each vehicle.
- 3. The blue "Registers" were used into 1906 when it became obvious to the legislators that they needed to be replaced, as they were identical to those used in Massachusetts since 1903. The 1906 legislature passed a revision requiring **a pair** of plates and the law was very specific as to the new design which mandated the color of black numbers on a white field. The new law was passed at the end of 1906, effective upon passage. However, the new plates had to be made and sign makers had to be contacted and a manufacturer had to be found.
- 4. The new undated, white porcelain enamel **pairs of plates** arrived in March of 1907 at the Secretary of State's office at his home in Morrisville. All motorists had to pay another fee and reregister their vehicles for the second time. Still no annual registration.
- 5. In 1908 the legislature again amended the law for **annual** registrations. New dated 1909 plates began that year.
- Vermont's regular license plates were **not dated** for: 1905, 06, 07, 08, 16, 17, 18, 69 and 77.

- 7. There was a 1908 listing book made by the Automobile Club of Vermont. I do not have a copy, nor have I ever seen one. It is referred to in the 1909 issue.
- 8. Both the Automobile Club and the State issued listing books for several years, as can be seen from the VHS inventory. Both issuers had a first printing in about June, with a second printing in August or September. Obviously the second printing is more useful as we have more registrations to review. These listing books stopped cold with the 1923 issues. After that other printers made them, and the use became more for law enforcement purposes.
