Introduction

This collection contains materials mainly from Frances LeBourveau Stockwell (1897-1980) and her husband, Leverett 'Lev' Charles Lovell (1889-1983) of Rockingham, Vermont, and other generations of their families. The collection also includes the allied families of Bacon, LeBourveau, Stockwell, Stone, and others. The papers were donated to the Vermont Historical Society by Elizabeth Lovell Bowman, a daughter of Frances and Lev Lovell, in August 2004, and Elizabeth's daughter, Susanna Bowman, in July 2010.

The collection is housed in three document storage boxes, one flip-top box, three flat storage boxes, one XMSC folio, one MS size C folder, and occupies 4.5 feet of shelf space.

Biographical Sketch

Leverett Charles Lovell was descended from Elijah Lovell (1749-1816) of Medway, Mass., a first settler of Rockingham, Vermont. 'Lev' Lovell was born, the son of Lewis Christopher Lovell of Rockingham, and Mamie O. Gaugh of Easthampton, Massachusetts, in Rockingham on October 2, 1889. Lewis Lovell owned a livery business which came to be known as the Lovell Track Farm in Rockingham. He was a prosperous farmer and prominent dealer in pure-bred holsteins, work and race horses, and hogs, including many prize-winning livestock. Lewis Lovell had inherited the farm from his father, Leverett Timothy Lovell (1841-1913), reputedly one of the largest real estate owners in Rockingham. At the time of his death, Leverett Timothy Lovell was also the largest taxpayer in the town, due to his many business ventures – hotel owner, livery stable owner, horse and livestock breeder, all of which he developed from a small butcher business early in life. The Lovell farm was dubbed "Lovell Track Farm" (aka Lovell Park) because sulky races were run there every Sunday from 1905 until the 1920s.

After graduating from the Bellows Falls High School in 1910, Lev Lovell attended the University of Vermont, graduating in 1914. In 1918, he married Frances LeBourveau Stockwell in Bellows Falls, Vermont. Her parents were Warren Edmund Stockwell (1873-1959) of Fitchburg, Massachusetts, and Annie Batten LeBourveau (1870-1930) of Fitzwilliam, New Hampshire. The Stockwells had lived in Bellows Falls while Frances was growing up. Around the time Frances married Lev Lovell, the Stockwells relocated to Montpelier, Vermont, where Warren Stockwell worked as clerk for the Railway Express Agency and later for National Life Insurance Company. When he died, on April 3, 1959, Warren Stockwell was again working as a Railway Express agent, in the Nashua, New Hampshire area.

On his "High Meadow Farm" in Rockingham, Lev Lovell raised unpedigreed Guernsey cattle. He was a U.S. mail carrier for over 25 years as well as a town lister and a Mason. Lev and Frances Lovell also sold real estate. After retiring to Florida, Lev Lovell became a charter member of the Manatee County Sons of the American Revolution. Leverett Lovell died at age 93 on May, 22, 1983 in Ludlow, Vermont.

Frances LeBourveau Stockwell, born March 9, 1897, in Bellows Falls, Vermont, was descended from Oziel Stockwell, founder of the Highland Baptist Church in Fitchburg, Massachusetts. She graduated from Bellows Falls High School in 1915 and from Teachers' Training School in that town. She taught school in Rockingham and then in Waterbury, Vermont, until her marriage to Leverett Lovell in 1918. She then became a prolific author of short stories, articles, juvenile works, poetry, and plays. Over a period of 28 years, her works were published in *Good Housekeeping, American Home, Vermont History, The Vermonter, Yankee Magazine, New England Homestead, Catholic Home Journal, Christian Herald, New York Herald-Tribune, Christian Science Monitor, The Boston Globe, and other publications.*

Frances Lovell's weekly column, "The Country Woman," appeared in the *Bellows Falls Times* for 21 years; her column, "Vermont Sketches" also appeared in the *Rutland Herald* for seven years. Energetic and active in many organizations, she was charter member of the Southern Vermont chapter of the League of American Pen Women (as well as its president), of the Poetry Society of Vermont, and of the League of Vermont Writers. She was also a member of the DAR. In 1940, she represented Vermont at the New York World's Fair with her poem, "Applewood." Frances Stockwell Lovell died April, 22, 1980, in Burlington, Vermont. She was a resident of Bristol, Vermont, at the time of her death.

In 1958, Lev and Frances Lovell jointly authored the *History of the Town of Rockingham, Vermont 1907-1957*. In 1959, they moved to Bradenton, Florida but spent summers in Ludlow, Vermont, at Lake Pauline. They were members of the Congregational Church.

The Lovells had five children, four daughters, Anne Stockwell Lovell Wilson Jackman (1919-2001), Elizabeth Gaugh Lovell Bowman (1922-2012), Aldis Stone Lovell Lynch Dow (1927-), and Patience LeBourveau Lovell Burke (1934-1996), and one son, Leverett Putnam Lovell (1923-1955).

Scope and Content

This collection consists mainly of diaries and correspondence of Frances Stockwell Lovell (FSL) and immediate family members as well as genealogical materials collected by FSL, Leverett Charles Lovell (LCL), and their daughter, Elizabeth Lovell (Mrs. William M.) Bowman (ELB) and the literary papers of FSL. Photographs, mainly concerning FSL, LCL, and the Lovell family, are also included. While the focus of the collection is on the generation of Frances and Lev Lovell (roughly 1900-1980), there is significant material from the earlier, related families to provide solid context.

Highlights of the collection include "books" created by FSL, LCL and ELB. These include scrapbooks documenting FSL's literary career and personal life; photo albums in which family members are carefully identified; genealogy in an annotated family bible; and binders prepared by ELB, with encapsulated pages containing genealogical information on the main and allied families. Unfortunately, the collection contains no financial records for the earlier Lovell generations, when they were developing their farm-related businesses and amassing their wealth in Rockingham in the 1800s and early 1900s. However, repurposed farm record books have sometimes been used as scrapbooks. The original records of livestock breeding and the like shed some scant light on the Lovell Farm activities, as do some of the photos, and the diary of Lewis Christopher Lovell.

The collection is divided into four series: Series I contains genealogy materials relating to the Lovell, LeBourveau, Stockwell, and other ancestral families of FSL and LCL. Series II contains the personal papers of FSL, ELB and others, including much material from the Bacon family. The letters between FSL and her cousin, Marjorie Bacon, contain some genealogical information. Series III contains FSL's literary papers, comprised of original book manuscripts, stories, articles, plays, and poetry, mostly in print or typescript. Series IV consists mainly of family photographs for the Lovell, LeBourveau, and allied families, but does also contain some photos of trips and local events, including a Vermont household auction, the funeral of Grace Coolidge, and a few images of the 1927 and Connecticut River floods in Bellows Falls, Vermont. Of interest in Series IV is a collection of photos of the early Lovell farm and the animals bred and raised there, thoroughbred and otherwise.

Note: Papers ostensibly collected by FSL and LCL comprise most of this collection. Papers collected by ELB are noted by the notation "[ELB]" in the inventory, or so stated in the section heading.

Related Collections and Materials

FSL donated a collection of materials from her childhood from Camp Hokomoko for Girls in Fairlee, Vermont, 1916-1919. It is housed in MSA 244.

Vermont Autographs #2 contains a collection of autographs collected by FSL, including those of Louise Andrews Kent, Rockwell Kent, and others.

The Leverett Putnam Lovell Papers, MSA 100, contains letters written by him to his parents, Lev and Frances, while he served in the Navy during WWII and the Korean War.

The book, 200^{th} Anniversary pictorial booklet of the town of Rockingham, Vermont including Bellows Falls..., was written by FSL, and published in 1953 (call no. 974.31 R59Lt).

Frances Stockwell Lovell and Leverett C. Lovell co-wrote the book, *History of the town of Rockingham, Vermont...1907-1957 with family genealogies*, to update an earlier published history of the town. It was published in 1958 (call no. 974.31 R59lel).

Elizabeth Lovell Bowman wrote the book, *Alexander Lovell Genealogy: The Ancestors and Descendants of Alexander Lovell of Medfield, Massachusetts, 1619-1709*, which she self-published in 2000 (call no. 929.2 L9434ab).
