
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



1960 Census of Population - Graphic Summary


Note: The 1960 Census geographic classification divides the country into four regions and nine divisions, as follows: Northeast region - New England division (Maine, N. H., Vt., Mass., R. L., and Cons.) and Middle Atlantic (N. Y., N. J., and Pa.); North Central - East North Central (Ohio, Ind., III., Mich., and Wis.) and West North Central (Minn., Iowa, Mo., N. Dak., S. Dak., Nebr., and Kana.); South - South Atlantic (Del., Md., D. C., Va., W. Va., N. C., S. C., Ga., and Fla.); East South Central (Ky., Tenn., Ala., and Miss.) and West - Mourtain (Mant., Idaka, Wes., Colo., N. Mex., Ariz., Utah, and Nev.) and Pacific (Wash., Oreg., Calif., Alaska, and Hawaii). In Rigures 1, 2, 3, and 5, the pre-1960 data refer, insofar as possible, to the present area of the United States, region, division, and State. In figure 5, fertility rate is the number of In Rigure 6, the data refer to presents five years ald and ever reporting this item; the category "Different State" includes persons living abroad five years prior to the census date. In Rigure 9, the base for the precent excludes employed persons with occupation not reported. 
