

O. Kutherford H. R. Colburn & L. D. Field morning of each Sabbath the subject of the Voted that above Committee be instructed to 3 oclock association meeting Bro. Rield resigned his office as Treasurer Togasurer came in and repented the rent on the room paid to July 15 1876 and was excused. Bro C. F. Ranney was then nominated and Attest 1. 16 Clements exected to fill the vacancy Attest N. H. blement Secy.
