

Mallary Farm

Introduction

This collection documents the operation of the Mallary Farm, located in Bradford and Fairlee, Vermont. The farm was founded by R. DeWitt and Gertrude Robinson Mallary in 1935 and was operated by them and their son, Richard W. Mallary, until 1970. The Mallarys developed a renowned herd of Holstein-Friesian cattle and were active in the Holstein-Friesian Association of America and a variety of civic organizations. The collection was donated to the Vermont Historical Society in 2002 and in 2010 by VHS President Peter Mallary, grandson of the farm's founders (ms. acc. no. 2002.11). The collection is stored in 15 document storage boxes, four flat boxes, and two archival flip-top boxes (19 linear feet).

Biographical Sketches

Raymond DeWitt Mallary (1898-1993), son of Raymond DeWitt Mallary (1851-1911) and Lucy Walker Mallary, became a prominent lawyer in Springfield, Massachusetts. He continued his law practice even after he and his wife purchased their farm in Vermont in 1935; he commuted to Vermont on weekends until 1952 when he moved to Vermont and spent only two days a week in Springfield with the new owners of his law practice. In partnership with his wife, he worked at building up their farm and herd. He served twelve years as president of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America and was very active in other associations and livestock shows such as the Eastern States Exposition in West Springfield, Massachusetts. One of his last official positions was chairman of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America convention at Boston, Massachusetts, June 28 to July 2, 1970.

Gertrude Robinson Mallary (1902-2002) was born August 19, 1902, in Springfield, Massachusetts, and attended Bennett Junior College, in Millbrook, New York. She married DeWitt Mallary September 15, 1923. After their decision to become serious farmers, she took a dairy herd management course at University of Connecticut. With no farming background, Gertrude became a recognized authority on dairy cattle breeding. While she sought good advice and used it, she, in turn, advised many breeders throughout North America as evidenced by her voluminous correspondence.

Mrs. Mallary was active in many community, professional, and political organizations. A Republican, she served in the Vermont House of Representatives, 1953-1957, and in the Vermont Senate, 1957-58. Among other activities, she was president of the Vermont Holstein Club, secretary of the New England Holstein Breeders Association, and editor of the *New England Holstein Bulletin*. Mrs. Mallary was an avid collector of Vermont books and manuscripts. A bibliography of her collection, *The Vermont Library of Gertrude Mallary*, was published in 1989 (VHS call no. 016.9743 M295). Mrs. Mallary died on March 2, 2002.

Richard Walker “Dick” Mallery (1929-), son of Gertrude and DeWitt Mallery, was born February 21, 1929, at Springfield, Massachusetts. He grew up on the farm and took an interest in the business. After graduating from Dartmouth College in 1949 Richard worked at the farm and soon acquired his own 350 acre farm nearby, called “Dick’s Place,” and began his own purebred herd. He was active in Holstein breeders’ associations, was an official judge of Holstein cattle, and was a trustee of the Eastern States Exposition. In 1956, Richard became a partner with his parents and farm manager in the Mallery Farm and they combined their herds.

Richard Mallery followed his mother in politics. Also a Republican, he represented Fairlee in the Vermont House of Representatives from 1961 through 1968, serving as speaker 1966-68, and then represented Orange County in Vermont Senate, 1969-1972. Afterwards he served as Vermont Secretary of Administration. He was elected to two terms in the U. S. House of Representatives, 1972-1974.

Institutional History

DeWitt and Gertrude Mallery bought 35 acres of land with a broken-down house and barn in Fairlee, Vermont, in 1935. They wanted a place to keep a couple of saddle horses for use while they were at their cottage on Lake Morey. By 1936, they had decided to make the place pay and acquired five purebred Holstein females and a bull calf from Osborndale Farm in Derby, Connecticut, one of the most famous Holstein breeding establishments in the country.

Originally, the cow idea was her husband’s, but to say that Mrs. Mallery accepted the idea with enthusiasm would be an understatement. Her interest, knowledge, and pure love of dairy cows grew and grew. Her ability to walk down the aisle of their dairy barn, reciting records, pedigrees, and traits of every cow reflects a devotion to the herd of credit to any herdsman. The Mallarys gradually added more land to their farm which grew to about 1000 acres including 320 acres of tillage in Fairlee and Bradford. The herd developed to about 170 to 200 head.

The first animals purchased for the farm were representative of Mallery planning. They bought old cows of good breeding; took their chances on such matters as sterility, bad legs and worn udders. They gambled old cow losses with the benefits of proven foundation dams. Willingness to take a chance with proven animals was a key to the Mallarys’ progress. Old cows with their records of production and transmitting abilities, plus the Mallarys’ undying faith, plus plenty of good cow care made Mallery Farms not only a high producing herd in itself, but a source of seed stock for Holstein breeders from coast to coast. The Mallarys and their cattle were recognized over the years with innumerable awards and prizes by various breeder organizations and at shows.

In 1939, they agreed to supply the milk for nearby Dartmouth College and thus built a favorable milk market. Poultry and egg production was also a part of the enterprise.

Scope and Content

These records contain the details of developing and maintaining a large purebred Holstein dairy farm. An overview of the history of the farm can be gleaned from the eight scrapbooks listed at the end of the collection (MSB39-42) which contain newspaper and trade journal clippings regarding the Mallery Farm and the Mallery family during their farming years. Additional historical information about the farm is filed in Doc 503, folders 35 and 36.

The Mallarys kept careful track of the financial aspects of their operation. The collection includes one box of financial records along with a second devoted to other types of business records, including a very large amount of correspondence with people connected to the cattle business such as fellow breeders, trade organizations, suppliers, veterinarians, and sales prospects.

The bulk of the collection (six boxes) is devoted to herd management records. This series includes:

- certificates of registry with the Holstein-Friesian Association of America (HFAA), which show names, birth dates, sire and dam
- herd classification records which give the names of animals with their ratings based on physical features
- record books which list, for each cow, monthly production, cost of production and cost of product
- advertising correspondence, ad designs, and clippings
- records of sales at cattle shows
- records regarding the disposition of animals with their names and biographies
- booklets of birth records with dates, names, registration numbers, sires and dams as well as sales and prospect information – some in card files
- records of the Mallarys' own dispersal sale in 1970

There is extensive detail on the planning, organization and functioning of the 1970 HFAA convention of which DeWitt Mallery was chairman. Also included is much correspondence and organizational details of regional and local associations.

The Mallarys were active in community affairs. Some of that activity is documented here in files for the 4-H Heifer Calf Committee, League of Women Voters, Fairlee Union School board, and Vermont Recreation Board.

The collection also contains two boxes of catalogs from livestock shows and dispersal auctions, some with notations added. Some, such as the catalog for the Eastern States Exposition, list exhibitors and details of livestock shown.
