

**Civil War Medal of Honor Winners
Cemetery Information
MSA 408**

Introduction

This collection consists of the records accumulated while locating and marking the graves of the thirty-two Union Civil War Medal of Honor recipients who are buried in Vermont. This was a Project of the Department of Vermont, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. The collection was given to the Vermont Historical Society in 2006 (ms. acc. no. 2006.) by Thomas P. McKenna. The collection occupies three folders (.5 linear feet).

Scope and Content

The collection is composed of two file folders, which contain the documents pertaining to each of the thirty-two recipients. Included in each recipient's file is contact information for the officials in charge of the cemeteries, directions to the cemeteries, how to find the graves within the cemeteries and what is inscribed on the graves. In some cases, all the inscriptions on family markers were copied. There are photos of many of the graves.

The third folder contains the application forms for nine Medal of Honor markers placed by the Project and pictures of some of the markers dedicated since 1993. The search for the grave of Medal recipient Charles Augustus Thompson who is not buried in Vermont is chronicled. There is a list of the 32 Medal of Honor Recipients, which summarizes individual information including the action for which each was cited. Another list includes all Medal of Honor recipients whose service is accredited to Vermont. Other documents in this folder relate to the process of obtaining and dedicating markers.
